Tower Opening Dates

The stone tower which stands at the top of Corstorphine Hill, and is fittingly our logo, was erected in 1871 by W. MacFie to commemorate the centenary of the birth of Sir Walter Scott. Later it was presented to the City by W. G. Walker in 1932, which marks the centenary of his death. From the top of the tower there are commanding views all round.

Each summer a band of Friends' volunteers open the tower for a couple of hours on alternate Sunday afternoons to enable anyone walking on the Hill at the time to enjoy the views. The schedule for tower opening dates (weather permitting) is shown below.

Ranger's Report

As the newly appointed Countryside Ranger for Corstorphine Hill I have been given the opportunity in this newsletter to introduce myself. I have been unofficially covering Corstorphine Hill since my predecessor Fiona Devlin moved on in September 2006 but it was only in Mid-April this year that I was told I would be concentrating on Corstorphine Hill permanently.

I have been working with the Council Ranger Service since December 2004 and have previously covered Cammo Estate and the Water of Leith. Along with Corstorphine Hill I am now also covering the River Almond and the Foreshore area from South Queensferry to Portobello.

On Corstorphine Hill over the next few months I will be progressing the "Woodland in and Around Towns" Project. The tree and path works have all been completed now but there is still map and interpretation boards to be installed, waymarkers showing path routes around the hill to be put in as well as picnic benches to be provided on the western side of the hill.

We are having a series of badger walks on the first 3 Thursdays of June this year. Booking for these is essential and places are limited to 10 per walk so those who are interested in coming along should book asap by calling the number below.

I am hoping to have a regular nature/wildlife column in this newsletter giving information on what to look out for during the differing seasons on the Hill.

With rain falling in the last few days it is amazing how the garden recovers and it looks great with the trees coming into leaf, and plants such as bluebells and Ragged Robin in flower. More sensory plants have been put in the bed opposite the animal seat. A low wall on the edge of the meadow was built by BTCV. This wall will eventually be planted up with small alpiners. BTCV have also added ropes to the bridge at the wetland to add a final touch to the project. On the "gardens open day" The Cockburn Association visitors were very impressed by the walled garden.

Walled Garden Gate
